2	<ul> <li>COVID-19 Roundtable</li> <li>MOL was onsite due to an overhead wire strike, but was more concerned that workers were not physical distancing. Received a warning that would issue an \$800 fine per person.</li> <li>Workers are becoming complacent and need constant reminders to distance.</li> </ul>

	(b) Broadband Back Up Alarms
	Decibel levels in the draft spec and Noise Bylaw were contradictory.
	Need a consistent alarm across a worksite.
	<ul> <li>City wants broadband backup alarms so as to not bother residents but the decibel of level of these alarms is quieter than the ambient noise.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>The City set up test scenarios City yards with smaller equipment. Track equipment is much louder. Tomlinson and Aecon offered to test broadband backup alarms on busy sites.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>The City was receptive to our comments and will talk to its legal department with regards to the proposed spec.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Winter maintenance contracts do not mention changing back up alarms. Likely will not see until the City spec is finalized.</li> </ul>
